



RULES PROPERTY ETIQUETTE

At Apple Knoll Farm, we value our facility and its friendly, professional atmosphere; we welcome your participation! Please read and observe the following rules, which are designed to provide a safe and enjoyable equestrian experience for all.

- Smoking is prohibited on all Apple Knoll Farm property.
- 5 mph speed limit for all cars and motorized vehicles throughout the property. This is a serious issue to those on horseback and to the owners of the property.
- Every rider must have a signed release / waiver of liability filed with the barn office.
- ASTM/SEI certified helmets must be worn at all times when mounted.
- Do not leave horses unattended when on cross-ties.
- Dogs must be leashed. Leash law applies, including the clearing of dog waste.
- Children under the age of 16 may not ride without the supervision of a parent or Apple Knoll Farm approved instructor.
- Children under the age of 12 must be accompanied by an adult at all times.
- Feeding horses, ponies or any other animals on the farm is prohibited, unless you have the owner's permission.
- There is no parking by the entry doors of the arenas.
- Please pick up any manure your horse deposits and sweep the area in which you tack up, both before you go out to ride and after you put your horse away.
- Cross-country safety vests are required for cross-country schooling and lessons. All jumping on Apple Knoll Farm cross-country courses requires an instructor or a friend / riding partner and the course MUST be open for schooling.
- If riding on the trails, let someone know your whereabouts.
- Be respectful of footing in the fields and on trails. If the footing is wet, ride on roadways and edges of fields when hacking.
- Rings must be left in condition they were found. Please pick up manure, litter, clothing and equipment after each lesson.
- Ring etiquette means cleaning up after your exercise and passing is left side to left side. Lessons have the right of way.
- You are responsible for picking up any manure your horse deposits in the barn, on the roads, walkways and rings.
